## Day 2 Ivinghoe to Salisbury via Stonehenge



### Location Description:

**Total Drive Time:** 2 Hours 12 mins

**Distance:** 116.0 miles

**Stonehenge:** One of the most famous places in the world to visit. The origins of the gigantic stone circle still remain a mystery although there are a lot of theories as to why Stonehenge was built

**Salisbury:** The next leg of the journey is the old medieval city of Salisbury dating back to the 13th century, a 21 minute drive from Stonehenge and offers a range of activities such as visiting the Cathedral which has the tallest spire in England or why not have a bite to eat at one of the top 10 historical pubs in Britain; the Haunch of Venison where they have a mummified hand on display said to have been removed from a cheating cards player and Winston Churchill was said to have planned the D-Day landings.

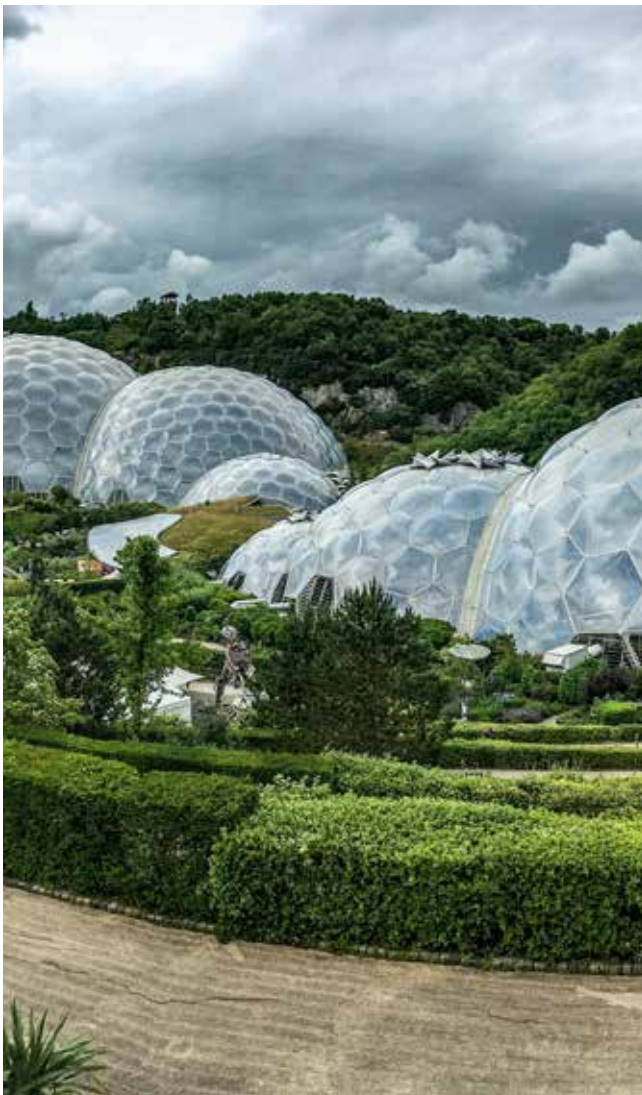

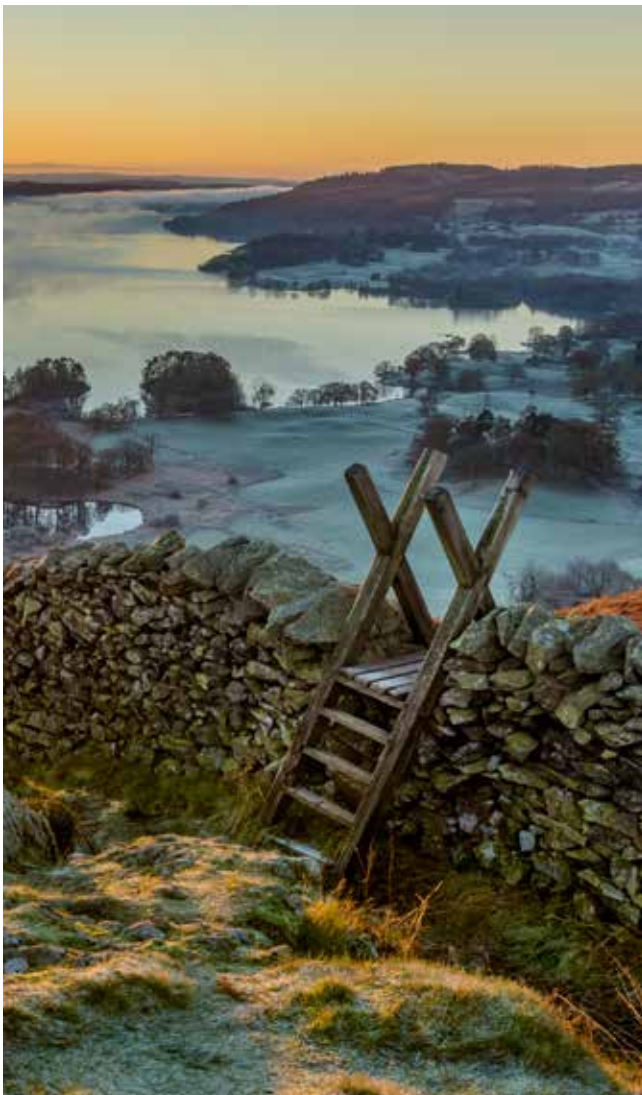
