

Aberystwyth is a historic market town, administrative centre and holiday resort within Ceredigion, West Wales. Located near the Rivers Ystwyth and Rheidol and provides some fantastic views. Although the name may seem to suggest otherwise, only the River Rheidol passes through the town; following the reconstruction of the harbour, the River Ystwyth skirts the town.

Aberystwyth has a pier and a fine seafront which stretches from Constitution Hill at the north end of the Promenade to the mouth of the harbour at the south, taking in two separate beach stretches divided by the castle. The seafront also boasts the oldest pier in Wales which offers the second best vantage point of Aberystwyth. The best vantage point is at the end of north beach's promenade, atop the 430 feet that is Constitution Hill, this is accessible via the Aberystwyth Cliff Railway. The longest cliff railway in Britain is a treat for all ages and offers superb views of the town, particularly the promenade's famed starling murmurations, so keep your cameras handy.
