



Brighton Hove & the South Downs

Brighton is an English seaside resort town. About an hour south of London by train, it's a popular day-trip destination. Its broad shingle beach is backed by amusement arcades and Regency-era buildings. Brighton Pier, in the central waterfront section, opened in 1899 and now has rides and food kiosks. The town is also known for its nightlife, arts scene, shopping and festivals.

Enjoy the famous Brighton pier and take a ride on the Big Wheel or walk through the lanes and explore the boutique shops and antique stores and get a real feel for Brighton and its heritage. An hour's walk along the coast in Hove, the Hove Museum and Art Gallery has a good exhibit on Photography as well as permanent and changing exhibitions in painting and sculpture. From rolling hills to bustling market towns, the South Downs National Park's landscapes cover 1,600km² of breath-taking views and hidden gems. A rich tapestry of wildlife, landscapes, tranquillity and visitor attractions.

The Mary Rose Museum

Raised off the seabed in 1982, the Mary Rose has now been wrapped in a beautiful 'air locked' Museum. Explore Henry VIII's favourite ship, one of the most challenging archaeological excavations of all time.
