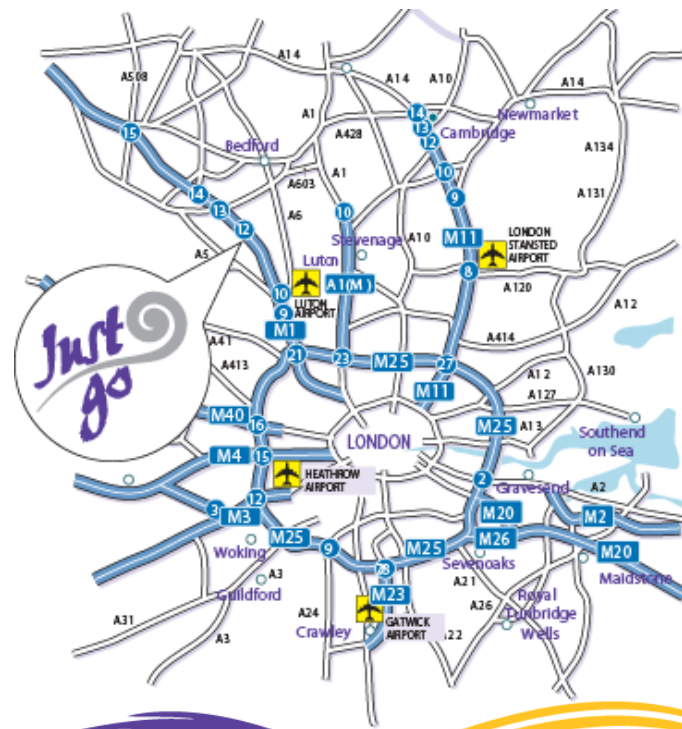
Villaggio Campeggio Santa Fortunata

Mount Vesuvius
