Camping Toscana Village

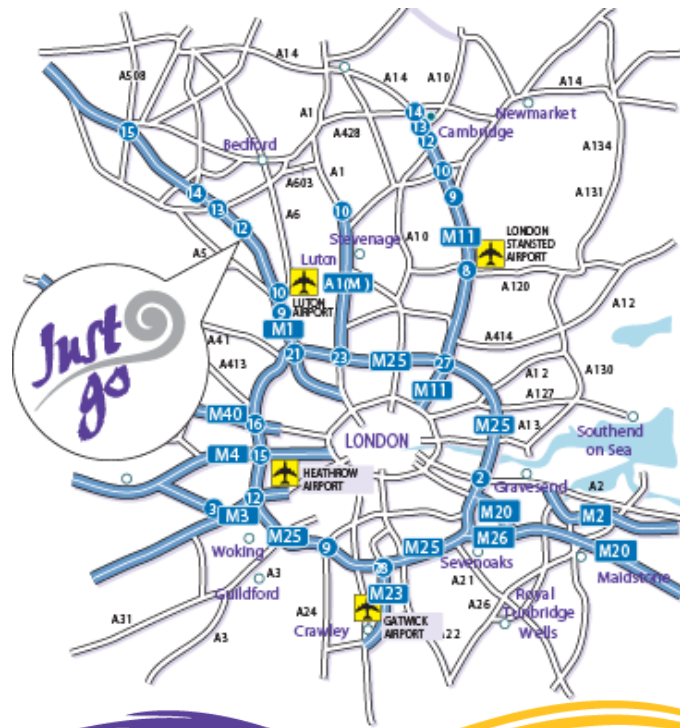

Italy, Tuscany

As well as beautiful countryside and architecture, the area of Italy known as Tuscany has had a huge impact on the world at large. Generally regarded as the birthplace of the Renaissance movement, many local historical figures have had a long lasting influence in the areas of science and art. Thankfully many examples remain to this day, and visiting Tuscany can at times feel like you are walking through the history books.

Tuscany has around 250 miles of coastline. The northern resorts are of the Italian deckchair to deckchair kind, but travelling south you will find some relief first in the umbrella pines of the Migliarino, San Rossore nature reserve and then further south in the coastal region of the Maremma where you will find unspoilt scenery and some good places to eat and drink.

The real charms of Tuscany lie inland with the cities and their surrounding countryside. Most notably Pisa, with its Leaning tower and Cathedral, the historic centres of Siena, Pienza and Florence the Medici Villa and Gardens and the Val d'Orca.

Along with less visited historical points of interest, the beautiful countryside and the exceptional food and wine, Tuscany is a delightful area to tour and explore.



Places to visit

San Gimignano

Nicknamed the medieval Manhattan, San Gimignano is a village in Tuscany famous for its 14 stone towers. At the height of San Gimignano's wealth and power more than 70 towers were built to defend the town against enemy attacks. After a plague devastated the city in 1348, San Gimignano's power faded and what followed was a time of relative peace, preserving many of the city's medieval towers.

Basilica di Santa Maria del Fiore

Begun in 1296 in the Gothic style and completed in 1436, the Basilica di Santa Maria del Fiore is Florence's beautiful Cathedral and symbol of the city. The exterior of the basilica is faced with polychrome marble panels in various shades of green and pink bordered by white. The Basilica is one of Italy's largest churches and until the modern era, the dome was the largest in the world. It remains one of the largest brick domes ever constructed.

Piazza del Campo

One of Europe's greatest medieval squares, the Piazza del Campo is the principal public space of the historic center of Siena, Tuscany. It is renowned worldwide for its beauty and architectural integrity. The Palazzo Pubblico and its famous tower, as well as various palazzi signorili belonging to the wealthiest of Siena families surround the shell-shaped piazza. The twice-per-year horse-race, Palio di Siena, involves circling the Piazza del Campo, on which a thick layer of dirt has been laid, three times and usually lasts no more than 90 seconds.
