


Hidden Valley Holiday Park




Dublin & the surrounding area

Dublin is ideally situated between the mountains and the sea. A 20 minute journey will take you from the bustling city to charming seaside towns and coastline. Dublin is a vibrant and welcoming place and hosts a busy calendar of festivals and events throughout the year. Check the local tourist information to find out what is on during your stay. It's no problem if you're timing is out, because the city has plenty of attractions to keep you busy at any time of the year.

If music is your thing, head to Cobblestone in the North Quay area. Downstairs in the musician's corner you will find acclaimed traditional Irish musicians and upstairs they host excellent lo-fi, traditional and folk bands. Why not follow it up with the perfect pint of Guinness in one of Kehoes delightful snugs.

In the morning you may require a little peace and quiet, and it can be found in the buildings and grounds of Trinity College. During the summer month's tours are given by students who will happily tell you about the College's past famous alumni, such as Oscar Wilde and Samuel Beckett.

Head south through the beautiful Wicklow Mountains and you will find the early Christian monastic site of Glendalough. Its location in beautiful scenery beside two lakes allows you to take a stroll along the waterfront after you have finished exploring the ruins and informative visitor's centre. In county Meath, west of the city, is the historical site of Bru Na Boinne, one of the most significant sites of Neolithic henges, tombs and standing stones in the world. With some areas of the site dating back to 35th century BC, the past inhabitants showed an understanding of astronomy and science far ahead of their time and have left a fascinating group of monuments to discover.

The Irish Museum of Modern Art

With changing exhibitions and an impressive permanent collection there is something for everyone.
