


## Blarney Caravan and Camping Park



# South West Ireland

The city of Cork is a great place to start your tour of the southwest of Ireland. The city is wrapped around one of the largest natural harbours in the world and has a wealth of historical and cultural attractions to keep you busy. Overlooking the River Lee is the 16<sup>th</sup> century castle that is now occupied by the Blackrock Castle Observatory. Created as an interactive science learning experience, there are exhibits and workshops to keep all ages entertained. When it's time to come back down to earth take a tour around the turrets and dungeons of this impressive monument.

The Glucksman Gallery promotes the creation and exploration of the visual arts and is housed in an award winning modern structure. With year round seasonal events and permanent exhibits on site, they cater to everyone passionate about the arts.

To the west of Cork lies the Dingle Peninsula and the early Christian church that is the Gallarus Oratory, built between the 6<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> century. Just off the coast is Great Blasket Island, inhabited until 1953 and now a National Park.



## Places to visit

### The Ring of Kerry

A 179km circular tourist route in County Kerry that takes in some of the best sights and scenery in the south west of Ireland. The route passes through Killarney National Park and other significant places of interest. In the summer months it is recommended drivers do it back to front, starting in Kenmare to avoid the tour buses.

### Blarney Castle.

Originally a wooden structure until it was rebuilt in 1446 by Cormac MacCarthy this is the home of the Blarney stone. This attraction once received the accolade of being the most unhygienic tourist attraction in the world; it's up to you to decide whether being imbued with the Irish 'gift of the gab' is worth it.

### Muckross House

A beautiful Elizabethan manor that now houses the Kerry Folk life center. Downstairs weavers, potters and bookbinders demonstrate their craft. Upstairs elegantly furnished interiors portray the lifestyle of the landed gentry in the 1800's.
