


Camping Zeeburg

This beautiful city in the North West of Holland is often referred to as the Venice of the North, due to its division into approximately 90 islands and 1200 connecting bridges. Throw in some stately house lined canals and galleries exhibiting some remarkable works of art and some questionable nightlife and it makes this liberal city an entertaining stopover on a tour of Europe. Originating as a fishing village in the 12th century, the city is in a horseshoe shape, a result of an ancient moat called the Singel that now forms the innermost ring of Amsterdam's 4 major canals.

Amsterdam's growth and significance within Europe peaked in the 17th century when it became a major centre for finance and diamond trading. The city has the oldest stock exchange in the world and some major attractions that include. The historic canals, numerous museums, coffee shops and the red light district.

The city is a fantastic place to wander, with many interesting shops, excellent food and drink and some beautiful architecture. Be sure to keep your eyes and ears open for the many cyclists and the quiet trams which can catch you by surprise.

Anne Frank House

A Museum with a Story. Visit the hiding place where Anne Frank wrote her diary during the Second World War. For more than two years, Anne Frank lived secretly with the other people in hiding in the back part of her father's office building at # 263 Prinsengracht. Be sure to book online for your time slot as the queues have been known to get into the hundreds.
