## Castle Farm Campsite



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

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# Bath

Bath is the largest city in the ceremonial county of Somerset, England, known for its Roman-built baths and has been a world heritage site since 1987 and is well deserving of this accolade.

When walking the streets you will see an architectural history that dates back to Roman times through the centuries to the Georgian era when the city was subject to the grand plan of architect John Wood and beyond. It is probably one of the most attractive cities in the country to spend time in.

There are the Pump Rooms where you can drink the water from the geothermal springs that brought the Romans to the area, and pours from the ground at a rate of over a million litres a day. Or you can bathe in them in the roof top pool of the new spa, surrounded by the impressive Georgian buildings.

Bath was Britain's centre of 'fashionable life' in the 18<sup>th</sup> century and the city reflects that in its parks and gardens and its long association with the arts.

Head out into the surrounding countryside and you will find rolling hills, attractive villages and an abundance of 'Bath stone' which is endemic to the area.

South of Bath you could find the Longleat Estate, with its beautiful Manor house, gardens and Safari park, or perhaps you would fancy visiting Glastonbury, home to the Tor and the gothic splendour of 800 year old Wells Cathedral.



## Places to visit

### Glastonbury Tor and Abbey

If you are close to Glastonbury it's worth making the detour to the top of the Tor. After the climb you are rewarded with far reaching views of Somerset and the surrounding countryside. Afterwards if you have any energy left, visit the vast ruins of Glastonbury Abbey in their park like surroundings. There is a visitors' centre on site that will bring you up to date on the historical details.

### The Theatre Royal

A 200 year old theatre in the centre of Bath housed in Beau Nash's first house. Renovated in 2010 and able to seat 900 they have a comprehensive catalogue of productions performed annually. ### Bath Abbey

England's last great medieval church started in 1499 with incredible stone carving apparent throughout. Take a journey to the top of the tower for outstanding views of the Roman Baths and Georgian terraces of Bath.
