

Brighton, Hove and the South Downs

Brighton is an English seaside resort town. About an hour south of London by train, it's a popular day-trip destination. Its broad shingle beach is backed by amusement arcades and Regency-era buildings. Brighton Pier, in the central waterfront section, opened in 1899 and now has rides and food kiosks. The town is also known for its nightlife, arts scene, shopping and festivals.

Enjoy the famous Brighton pier and take a ride on the Big Wheel, or walk through the lanes and explore the boutique shops and antique stores and get a real feel for Brighton and its heritage. Or maybe they would enjoy finding their way through the tunnels and chambers of Newhaven Fort, charging around the 10 acre site or playing in the adventure playground.

An hour's walk along the coast in Hove, the Hove Museum and Art Gallery has a good exhibit on Photography and the Moving Picture as well as permanent and changing exhibitions in painting and sculpture.

If you fancy exploring the south coast slightly further take a trip along to Portsmouth to visit the Mary Rose museum. The Mary Rose Museum is a located at Historic Dockyards in Portsmouth displaying the marvellous Tudor warship.



Places to visit

The Mary Rose Museum.

Raised off the seabed in 1982 after 500 years in the ocean, the Mary Rose has now been wrapped in a beautiful 'air locked' Museum. On entering the controlled environment you will find the most comprehensive collection of Tudor artefacts to be amassed in one location.

The Lanes

The Lanes were originally the centre of the sleepy fishing village of Brighthelmstone. Today the series of twisting alleyways are home to antique stores, jewellers and designer boutiques. The square on East Street is a great spot for a delicious al fresco meal accompanied by some live jazz.

Brighton Pier

The Brighton Marine Palace and Pier, commonly known as Brighton Pier or the Palace Pier is a Grade II* listed pleasure pier in Brighton, England. Opened in 1899 and home to fairground rides, bars, restaurants and deckchairs to enjoy the sea view.
