


Seal Shore Camping



Campbeltown, Oban & the Isle of Mull

To the south of Fort William down Loch Linnhe is Oban. This small town is situated in a beautiful crescent shaped bay and is known as the 'Gateway to the Isles' and the 'Seafood capital of Scotland'.

Ferry services run from here to Lismore, Colonsay, Islay, Coll, Tiree, Mull, Barra and South Uist in the outer islands.

Oban is also home to Scotland's leading marine conservation experience and its location on the shores of Loch Creran makes them ideally placed to run their seal rescue facility. Breeding programs involving sea horses, hourly feeding, interactive talks and over 40 displays of marine life mean you will never be short of things to see or facts to learn.

Oban has some of the best quality seafood in Scotland arriving daily to its harbour. There are some excellent restaurants and it has its own whiskey distillery that pre dates the town, and has been producing whiskey since 1794.

Travel south along the A816 taking in the beautiful coastal scenery and you will arrive in the quaint fishing village of Tarbert. Take a break from driving to view the local wildlife, including birds of prey and deer or jump on a boat for a look at the dolphins and basking sharks that live in the sheltered waters.

Continue on the only road around the Kintyre Peninsula and you will arrive in Campbeltown, home to the Springbank Distillery and with ferry access to Ardrossan on the mainland.



Places to visit

Auchindrain Township Open Air Museum

This museum focuses on the last remaining township abandoned in 1963 and is presented how the township would have looked at the turn of the last century. This open air museum consists of numerous buildings re-created with age appropriate items and gives the visitor an insight into the daily lives of its once inhabitants.

The Fossil Tree and the Burg

This challenging 12 mile there and back walk will take you through some dramatic highland scenery, down ladders to rocky beaches and at the midway point treat you to MacCulloch's rare fossilized tree. The final section of the walk is tidal so check the tide times before setting out.
