


Folkestone Camping and Caravanning Club Site

Dover

Dover is a coastal town in England's southeastern county of Kent. It's a major port for ferries to Calais, in France. Built to repel invasions from across the English Channel, medieval Dover Castle overlooks the town and houses the extensive Secret Wartime Tunnels. The iconic White Cliffs of Dover are symbolic safeguards at Britain's closest point to continental Europe

The White Cliffs of Dover are one of Britain's most iconic landmarks, and the star of countless UK and Hollywood movies. Stunning as they are there is plenty more to Dover than just the cliffs.

It is the nearest British town to France - a mere 90 minutes by boat. It is also filled with lots of fascinating places to visit allowing you to explore the Town's history. Its strategic position has been evident throughout its history: archaeological finds have revealed that the area has always been a focus for people entering and leaving Britain.

The name of the town derives from the name of the river that flows through it, the River Dour.

The town has been inhabited since the Stone Age according to archaeological finds, and Dover is one of only a few places in Britain - London, Edinburgh, and Cornwall being other examples - to have a corresponding name in the French language, Douvres.



Places to visit

Dover Castle

Roam through centuries of history at Dover Castle, from the Romans to the 20th century, in an action-packed day out.

White Cliffs of Dover

The White Cliffs of Dover are cliffs that form part of the English coastline facing the Strait of Dover and France. The cliffs are part of the North Downs formation. You can get a great view of the Famous White Cliffs of Dover from Dover Beach itself.

Dover Museum

This modern museum tells the fascinating story of This rich and important area. It was originally founded in 1836 and is now one of the county's premier tourist attractions. In 1991 the museum was rehoused in a brand new three-storey building, situated behind its original Victorian facade. The history galleries tell the fascinating story of the development of the town and its famed port, using original objects, graphics and models.
