
## The Woods Caravan Club Site

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

# Edinburgh

If you have the time, head over the Scottish border to the vibrant city of Edinburgh. With its annual program of world renowned festivals and celebrations there is enough to keep you entertained every day of the year.

Edinburgh has beautiful architecture and an abundance of historical sites to visit, however with millions of visitors each year it does pay to book ahead with some of the more popular attractions.

If you're watching the pennies the city also has a wealth of free attractions to visit including numerous galleries, museums and even tours of the Scottish Parliament building. Alternatively you can just wander the streets and soak up the atmosphere of this welcoming city.

Heading out of the city you are only a few miles from the coast and the dramatic Lothian scenery. Why not go on a tour of local castles, there are 6 in a 20 mile radius of the city. Or follow the Mary Queen of Scots route, visiting the places she stayed and hearing tales of the love, betrayal and murder that overshadowed her short life.



## Places to visit

### Edinburgh Castle

No trip to Edinburgh would be complete without a trip to the imposing Edinburgh Castle. Perched on Castle Rock, it is a constant presence in the city and has been since the 12<sup>th</sup> century witnessing many of Scotland's key power struggles and wars. Subject to many restoration projects over the centuries, very little remains that was built before the heavy bombardment the castle received during the Lang Siege. However some exceptions, like St. Mary's church, built in the 12<sup>th</sup> century remain.

### Arthur's Seat

A perfect escape from the bustle of the city or a bracing walk to clear your head from last night's whiskey tasting session. Either way you will be rewarded with fabulous views across the city and beyond. Bring your running shoes if you are feeling particularly energetic and reward yourself with a hearty Scottish breakfast afterwards.

### Botanical Gardens

With its roots in the 17th century, the [Royal Botanic Garden](#) is a well established breathing space for tourists. Cold days make the hothouses a major attraction, but in spring a walk on the Chinese Hillside - dotted with the largest collection of wild specimens outside China, with a pause for thought in the Ting (traditional pavilion) - is good for the soul.
