

Fort William, Ben Nevis & the Isle of Skye

Fort William is a town in the western Scottish Highlands, on the shores of Loch Linnhe. It's known as a gateway to Ben Nevis, the U.K.'s highest peak, and Glen Nevis valley, home to Steall Falls. The nearby Nevis Range Mountain Resort has ski runs and forest trails. In the town centre, the West Highland Museum focused on regional life and history. To the northeast, Ben Nevis Distillery explores whisky production.

Ben Nevis is the highest mountain in the British Isles, located in Scotland. Standing at 1,345 metres above sea level, it is located at the western end of the Grampian Mountains in the Scottish Highlands.

To the west of Fort William is the Isle of Skye. The Isle of Skye, connected to Scotland's northwest coast by bridge, is known for its rugged landscapes, picturesque fishing villages and medieval castles. The largest island in the Inner Hebrides archipelago, it has an indented coastline of peninsulas and narrow lochs, radiating out from a mountainous interior. The town of Portree, a base for exploring the island, features harbourside pubs and boutiques.

Why not visit Dunvegan Castle, the family seat of the Macleod clan for over 800 years. This dramatic castle houses a fine collection charting the history of what is often called the longest inhabited home in Scotland. The beautiful formal gardens were planted in the 18th century and hold many hidden delights, and behind the castle are several hectares of woodland that are a contrast to the stark moorland landscape around it.



Places to visit

The West Highland Museum

The location of the renowned collection relating to Bonnie Prince Charlie and the Jacobite rebellion, this museum in the high street of Fort William also houses a wealth of curious and fascinating historic objects relating to west highland life through the ages. A room devoted to the Fort, built using wood from the governor's office and a display of Neolithic axes and pottery are just a few of the many exhibits to view.

Ben Nevis

The mountain is a popular destination, attracting an estimated 100,000 ascents a year, around three-quarters of which use the Pony Track from Glen Nevis. The 700-metre cliffs of the north face are among the highest in Scotland, providing classic scrambles and rock climbs of all difficulties for climbers and mountaineers.
