


## Riverside Chalet and Campsite

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

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# Inverness, Loch Ness & the Cairngorms

Inverness is regarded as the capital of the Scottish highlands and is the most northerly city in the United Kingdom. Lying at the mouth of the river Ness with water flowing from nearby Loch Ness it provides a great base to explore the surrounding Highlands or mount an expedition to find 'Nessie'.

There are many walks to enjoy, along the riverbank past the pavement cafes to the Ness Islands where the anglers fish for Atlantic salmon. Or up on Craig Phadrig, once the stronghold of Pictish kings and now home to a diverse range of wildlife and stunning views of the Moray Firth.

Relax with a cruise down the Caledonian canal to the world famous Loch Ness, or if your timing is right, watch the annual Highland Games in its purpose built stadium. Head out into the wilderness of the Cairngorms National Park, home to 25% of the threatened wildlife species in the UK. Don't forget to bring your binoculars or you could miss out on the Capercaillies, Ptarmigans or Golden Eagles that call it home.

The National Park has a host of activities to keep you interested no matter the time of year. In summer, as well as the walking and biking to enjoy you could head to Lake Morlich to try the numerous water sports on offer. In winter the park has three ski fields to choose from and you never have to travel far for a wee dram to warm you up afterwards.



## Places to visit

### Fort George

With work completed in 1769 at a cost in today's money of over a billion pounds, this epic fortification was built to the highest standards of artillery fortification of the day. Able to house 1600 soldiers and 2500 barrels of powder and as well as a home for the governor, brew houses, bake houses and everything to keep the fort self sufficient, it's armaments included twelve 42-power guns.

### The Falls of Foyers

A beautiful waterfall reached by a steep meandering path through the woods and along the river's edge on the south side of Loch Ness. There are some steps and bridges to cross and the possibility of seeing red squirrels and pine martins. A village shop and tea room at the start is a good place to recoup your energy.

### Urquhart Castle

An imposing ruined castle atop a hill overlooking the dark waters of Loch Ness dating from between the 13<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> century. Admission includes a short film charting the history of the castle and its inhabitants over the years and its involvement in the Scottish war of Independence in the 1500's. The attending staff and tour guides are helpful and knowledgeable and the views spectacular.
