
Willow Holt Caravan and Camping Park



Lincoln

Lincoln is a Cathedral City and the county town of Lincolnshire - one of the UK's largest counties. Part of the East Midlands, Lincolnshire sits on the East coast of England, to the north of Norfolk and the south of Yorkshire - nestled between the Humber and the Wash.

Lincoln city centre is compact enough to walk around yet has so much to explore. Whether you want to go shopping, relax with a cup of tea or dine in style, you can do it in Lincoln. With unique attractions such as Lincoln Cathedral and Steep Hill, culture at the Drill Hall and The Collection and stunning, waterside restaurants and bars, you will want to stay for longer to discover all of Lincoln for yourself.

Lincoln has a rich aviation heritage stretching from the UK's early aviation history through to the present day. Explore this hidden side of Lincoln with the Aviation Trail. A revised Walk & Ride service has launched in Lincoln, nicknamed the Steep Hill Shuttle, helping visitors, shoppers and others in the city get around easier.

Why not enjoy the sights of Lincoln and the countryside from a different perspective aboard a 50 - 60 minute guided canal trip with very entertaining commentary about Lincoln's past and present. Enjoy a cruise whatever the weather with inside and outside seating. The lower deck of the boat is fully heated, or you can enjoy a great view from the top deck under canopy.

Lincoln Castle

Built by William the Conqueror in 1068, Lincoln Castle has stood for hundreds of years as a symbol of power and seat of justice. Since 2010 we have been revealing its hidden history in a £22m restoration. Come and explore the all-new Lincoln Castle. Scale the heights of the Medieval Wall Walk, follow in the footsteps of prisoners in the Victorian Prison, and immerse yourself in the Magna Carta story. Opening Times 10am - 5pm.
