



# North Wales & Snowdonia

The word Snowdonia derives from the mountain Snowdon which at 3560ft is Wales highest. The area that covers the northern part of Wales is renowned for its dramatic and challenging scenery and is a magnet for hill walkers and climbers. Those less energetic among you can enjoy the scenery as you drive through the beautiful valleys topped with castle ruins and the remains of slate quarries or take the mountain railway up to Snowdon's peak.

When you have tired of the mountains, head to the coast and enjoy some beach time or take the Ffestiniog steam railway to the slate mining town of Blaenau Ffestiniog. There are plenty of historic monuments in Wales but two of the best have to be Conwy and Caernarfon castles.

A large part remains of the latter and the kids will love exploring its tunnels and passageways. If they still have energy to burn, take them to Snowdonia's unique eco attraction Greenwood Forest Park, to travel on the human powered roller coaster or Wales longest sledge run.

In the heart of Snowdonia close to Blaenau Ffestiniog lie the Slate Caverns of Llechwedd. Once a hive of industry they now offer a selection of tours into the depths of the mine. Take a journey ¼ a mile and 150 years back in time on the old tramway and then 500ft down into the deep mine to discover the stories of the men and children who once worked here. If you fancy something a little more adrenalin based you could try the longest series of zip wires in Europe. Taking you over a group of mountains the longest is 1000 meters and you'll get great views of the mine workings 100 feet below.



## Places to visit

### Penrhyn Castle

This enormous 19<sup>th</sup> century Neo-Norman castle sits between Snowdonia and the Menai Strait. It's full of fascinating items, elaborate carvings, plasterwork and mock Norman furniture, a fascinating industrial railway museum, model railway and superb dolls museum. The 60 acres of grounds include parkland, an exotic tree and shrub collection and a Victorian walled garden.

### King Arthurs Labyrinth

Don your hard hat and join your hooded guide into a boat and back in time. Travel across the underground lake, through the waterfall and into the maze of tunnels where you will hear stories of Arthur and his feats of bravery and supernatural powers. Brought to life through dramatic scenes, light shows and special effects there is something to intrigue young and old alike.
