
## Jordanstown Loughshore Caravan Park.



# Northern Ireland

If you are planning a visit to Northern Ireland there is no better place to start than the cliffs of Slieve League in County Donegal. More remote than the Cliffs of Moher but at over 3 times the height of their more famous west coast equivalent, these are the ones to visit. For incredible views 2000ft down to the sea traverse the ridge of 'one man's path'. If you're with children, hold onto them tight!

For those who fancy a bit of shopping there's no better place than Belfast. Shopping in Belfast is special because with high street stores, family owned businesses, designer boutiques, markets and the incredible Victoria Square and Castle Court shopping centres it really does have something for everyone! Whilst in Belfast why not step back in time and soak up some Northern Irish heritage and visit the Titanic museum or Antrim Castle.

A tour of Ireland wouldn't be complete without a visit to the unusual basalt rock formation that is 'The Giants Causeway'. Made a UNESCO site in 1986, the 40,000 pillars that form the causeway rise up from the ground to a maximum height of 12 meters and though generally hexagonal in shape can have as many as 12 sides. Formed from volcanic eruptions 40 million years ago, their name reflects the illusion that they form a causeway to Scotland, which on a clear day can be seen across the water. From the Giants Causeway you are able to take a narrow gauge steam train along the coast to Old Bushmills Distillery. Licensed in 1608 by James the 1<sup>st</sup> it is the oldest whiskey distillery in the world.



## Places to visit

### Giants Causeway

The Giant's Causeway is an area of about 40,000 interlocking basalt columns, the result of an ancient volcanic eruption. It is located in County Antrim on the north coast of Northern Ireland, about three miles northeast of the town of Bushmills.
