## Rivendale Holiday Park



# The Peak District

The Peak District lies in the centre of Britain, it was designated the United Kingdom's first National Park in 1951 and has been attracting visitors drawn to its beautiful views ever since. Much of the parks area lies above 300m rising to 636m on Kinder Scout, so there is plenty of opportunity for commanding views, characterised by rolling hills and grit-stone escarpments. There is a history of wool manufacturing in the area and remains of the narrow stone mills, often powered by water wheels, can be found in the river filled valleys. In the heart of the Park you will find the town of Buxton home to Buxton Spring Water, which exits the ground at a constant 28 degrees and is then exported all over the world.

The town has many architectural nods to the spa town of Bath who with its healing waters was also responsible for attracting visitors over the centuries. You are able to drink your fill for free from the many springs as you walk around the town.

The more daring visitors among you could take to the skies with one of the many paragliding clubs, or go potholing underground through the labyrinths of limestone caves or with more than 1800 miles of paths and bridleways you could just go for a wander and enjoy the scenery.



## Places to visit

### Pooles Cavern and country Park

Take a journey beneath the earth and discover a place where stalactites grow and limestone deposits have lined the chambers over millions of years. Illuminated by LED lighting you will see this underground world as never before. Back above ground take a walk up to Grin Low and Solomon's Temple view point with beautiful views of the surrounding Peak District.

### Derwent Dam

Located between Howden and Lady Bower reservoirs this is a great area to explore depending on your capabilities. Made famous by the dam busters 65 years ago as the place they tested the bombs, the dam is a striking piece of architecture for a structure that was built at the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> century as a way to supply the water the industrial cities of South Yorkshire and the East Midlands demanded.

### Haddon Hall

Standing on a rocky outcrop, Haddon Hall is one of the finest examples of Medieval and Tudor architecture in the UK. Step back in time with a walk around the house and gardens which due to its location has remained largely untouched and finish up in the onsite restaurant to sample some fresh local produce.
