

Shrewsbury

Set amongst the countryside near to the Welsh Borders, Shrewsbury is one of England's finest medieval market towns. The Town centre is packed with steep narrow streets and alley ways and Black & White buildings. It boasts over 600 listed buildings which include the Castle which is now a regimental museum and the world famous Shrewsbury Abbey.

Charles Darwin was born and educated in Shrewsbury and all around you will find reminders of his association with the town.

The River Severn forms a loop around the town centre allowing for the perfect setting for a gentle river side walk or a trip on the new pleasure boat. There is plenty to do in Shrewsbury from the many shops to choose from to the yearly Flower show or Shrewsbury Folk Festival.



Places to visit

Jailhouse Tours

Walk in the footsteps of prisoners who have been residents of the wings during the last 200 years. Discover what happens behind the high walls and locked doors. Experience the hidden world of capital punishment and see first hand one of the last working execution rooms in the country. Jailhouse Tours conducts guided tours run by ex-prison officers who once managed these very wings. Our two-hour tours give you the opportunity to view this historic building and learn more about its history dating back to 1793.

Shrewsbury Castle

Shrewsbury Castle houses collections of the Shropshire Regimental Museum Trust including pictures, uniforms, medals, weapons and other equipment from the 18th Century to the present day. It was originally built by Roger de Montgomery in 1070. In 1924 the Shrewsbury & Atcham borough council undertook a process of restoration and opened the castle to the public in 1926.
