

South Wales, the Brecon Beacons & the Gower Peninsula

If you are passionate about the outdoors, head to south Wales. In contrast to the 19th century when the area was a hive of industry for coal and iron mining, it is now a haven for outdoor pursuits, particularly in and around the Brecon Beacons. The Brecon Mountains are characterised by treeless peaks and forested valleys and it is not unusual to come across remnants of past industrial activity. Pen-y-Fan is the highest mountain in Wales after Snowdonia and is one of a series of peaks in a National Park that covers 519 sq miles. Walk anywhere in the Park and you are likely to be rewarded with stunning waterfalls, extensive underground cave systems, dramatic views and strings of wild ponies.

South of the Brecon Mountains lies the city of Cardiff, the capital of Wales. The Welsh National Rugby team are based in the Millennium Stadium here. Cardiff is a hub for national road and rail networks and also has an International airport.

Head west past Swansea and you will arrive at the Gower Peninsula. In 1956 it was the first area in the UK to be designated 'An Area of Outstanding Beauty' and to this day retains all the characteristics worthy of its classification. Covering only 70sq miles the Gower has a wealth of beautiful beaches, several of which have won awards and in summer is a haven for water sport enthusiasts. The oldest human remains (33,000 years) to have been found in Europe were discovered in one of the many caves on the peninsula and if castles are your thing, there are six to choose from.



Places to visit

Big Pit National coal Museum

Kit yourself out with helmets, headlamps and belts and take a trip 90 meters down in the lift to explore the mines. Informative guides on hand to answer your questions and explain what the life and conditions were like for the men, women and sometimes children who worked here. Free Entry. **Address:** Blaenafon.
