

Stonehenge, Avebury & Salisbury Plain

Stonehenge cuts an imposing profile in the stark landscape of Salisbury Plain and has recently benefitted from a redevelopment of the area and a new information centre. It stands in an area renowned for its prehistoric ruins and burial grounds and Stonehenge itself dates back to 3000BC. To the north is Avebury Henge, a monument comprising three circles of standing stones around the village of Avebury, also under UNESCO protection. Whilst in the area why not use the opportunity to visit West Kennet Long Barrow and Silbury Hill, two monuments which pre date the henge by several centuries.

To the west is Laycock, a village that is owned almost in its entirety by the National Trust. The village buildings here can date back to the 15th Century and the location has been used in several films, most notably two of the Harry Potter series.

On the edge of the village is Laycock Abbey founded in 1229 by the Countess of Salisbury as a nunnery and is now home to the Fox Talbot Museum. Managed by the National Trust they open the doors to visitors on a daily basis. During the summer months the beautiful gardens are host to outdoor musical performances and it is not unusual to see queues of people with deck chairs and picnic hampers waiting at the front gates.



Places to visit

Stourhead House and Gardens

Stourhead has gardens that were designed by Capability Brown and both the gardens and house are now run by the National Trust. It features a beautiful lake with several buildings such as a temple, a medieval cottage and grotto to explore.

Salisbury Cathedral

Completed in 1258 this is one of the finest gothic cathedrals in the UK, with the tallest spire topping off at 404 feet. Informative guides will happily divulge the history of the cathedral and buildings in the grounds. There is also a copy of the Magna Carta in the Chapter house to view.

Caen Hill Locks

A fantastic feat of engineering, this run of 29 consecutive locks was the last thing to be completed on the Kennet and Avon canal and was designer John Rennie's solution to climbing the 237ft hill on the outskirts of Devizes. A great place to sit and watch the boats, walk and cycle along the towpath or have some food at the canal side cafe.
