



Cambridge is the home of the University of Cambridge, founded in 1209 and one of the top five universities in the world. Many tourists visit Cambridge each year to see the historic university, its buildings and the beautiful Backs. King's College Chapel is the most famous building in Cambridge. Outside, the best views of the chapel are from Kings Parade and Queen's Road, and from its entrance via Senate House Passage or Trinity Lane. You need to pay to enter, but the fan vaulted ceiling, stone carving and stained glass are worth it. You can also attend a chapel service.

Explore the quaint passages set around the historic market place and colleges where a unique and relaxing shopping experience can be found with a blend of independent shops and high street brands. If shopping isn't your thing you can go punting on the River Cam, enjoy a picnic in the park or join a walking tour of the city.
