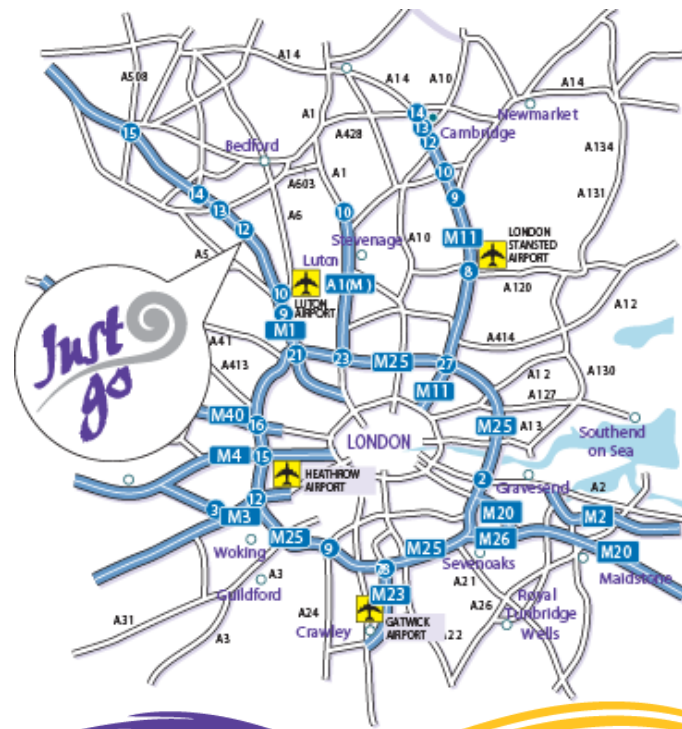
Camping Le Grand Champ

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France, Chamonix

In 1741 two Englishmen, Windham and Pococke, discovered the 'Chamouny' valley and its glaciers.

Their expedition was met by a rural population of mountain farmers, and a humble monastery. This community lived off animal husbandry and a sparse harvest of oats and rye. Windham and Pococke explored the valley and visited the Mer de Glace (Sea of Ice).

The stories of their exploits, published in literary journals throughout Europe, started a craze to find out more about Chamonix.

In 1924 Chamonix hosted the first Winter Olympic Games. Skiing was introduced in Chamonix at the end of the 19th century by Dr Payot.

The first big winter season was in 1906-07. Much of the initiative came from the 'Club Alpine Français' which organized a local winter sports competition.



Places to visit

Le Brevent Cable Car

This cable car offers some fantastic and amazing views. Discover the Brevent and its great panoramic view of the Chamonix Valley including a stunning view of Mont Blanc. From Chamonix, you can take the gondola/telecabine lift to Plan Praz (1,999m), then the cable car to Le Brévent (2,525m).

Tramway Du Mont-Blanc

Take an adventure ride on the Mont-Blanc Tramway and discover a variety of alpine landscapes along the journey and some stunning and fantastic views too.

Chamonix Sport Aventure

A local Chamonix based multi-sports company offering all mountain activities in winter and summer. It covers all resorts in the Chamonix Valley including the spectacular Grands Montets which is between 1235m and 3300m. The Grands Montets area enables you to ski some of the greatest downhill descents on piste, off piste or through the glaciers.
