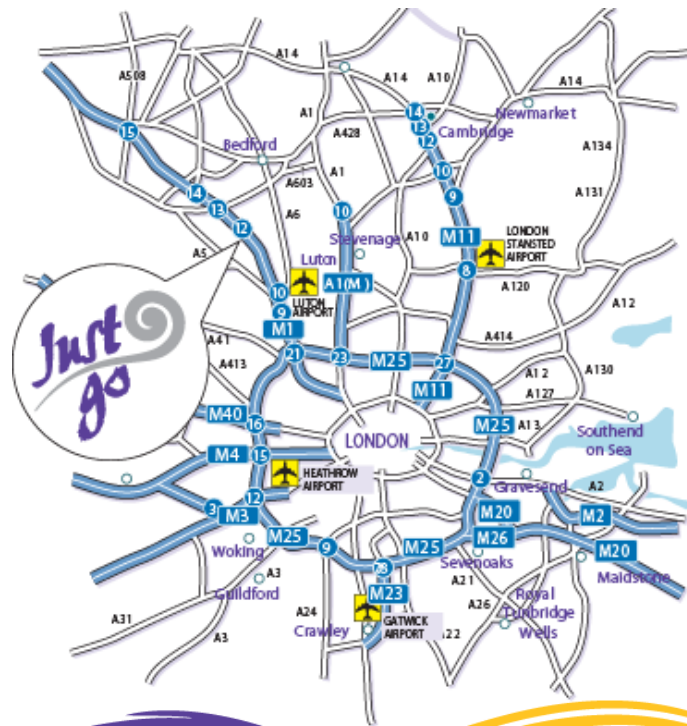

A couple of hours spent behind the wheel can take you from the dramatic mountains and picturesque hill top villages, through acres of serene lavender fields to the azure coastal waters of the Mediterranean.

The local cuisine benefits from produce grown over the long summer months and a walk through any of the villages on market day is an assault on the senses.

Landmarks like the Roman built Pont du Gard and the naturally formed Grand Canyon du Verdon are sure to impress. As is mans tenacity and desire to inhabit the often challenging mountainous landscape.

A perfect area to combine both beach and inland activities, outstanding cuisine and beautiful landscapes, Provence is definitely worth the drive.



Places to visit

Pont du Gard

A 275 meter stretch of the Nimes Aquaduct crossing the river Gardon, the Pont du Gard has remarkably stood the test of time since it was constructed by the Romans around 40AD. The progressive engineering abilities of the Romans can be seen in its 3 tiered structure that stands 50 meters above the river and has a gradient of 1 in 3000 over its entire length. One of Frances most popular landmarks, a UNESCO world heritage site and one of the best preserved aqueducts in the world.

Moustiers-Sainte-Marie.

If you are lucky enough to visit this cliff top village in twilight, you will see it diffused in a pink glow, a result of the sun reflecting on surrounding limestone mountains. Both this natural phenomenon and the village's precarious perch 100m up in the Verdon Gorge have helped contribute to its status as one of France's most beautiful villages. A natural spring from the cliff side provides water power that has resulted in a long history of pottery making known locally as faience.

Massif de l'Esterel.

Covering an area of 320 sq km with half under protected status, this coastal mountain range is home to swathes of oak forests, deep ravines and highest point reaching 618m. A haven for walkers and mountain bikers the area is in close proximity to Cannes in the east and Saint Raphael in the west. Also home to the Cap Esterel holiday village.
