Burgstadt Camping Park

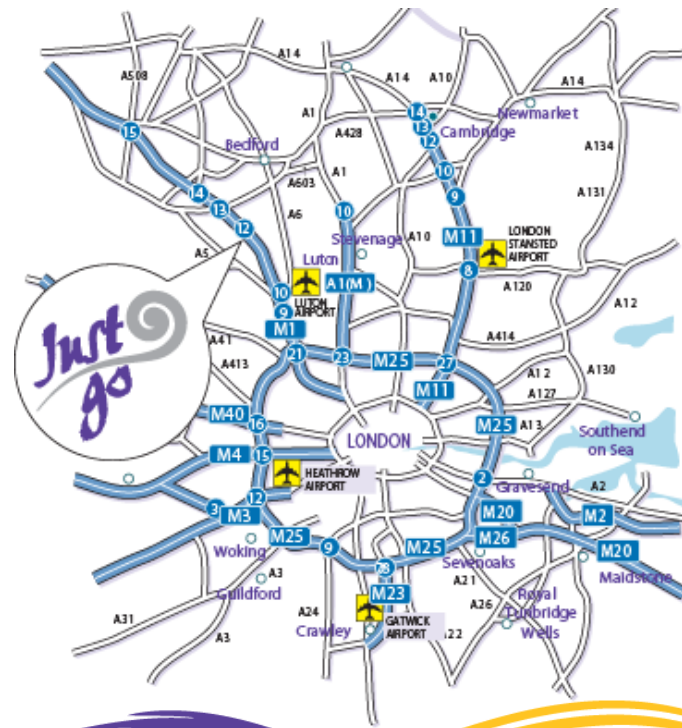

Germany, Frankfurt

Frankfurt, a central German city on the Main River, is a major financial hub. It's the birthplace of writer Johann Wolfgang von Goethe, whose home is now the Goethe-Haus museum - which, like much of the city, was destroyed during World War II and rebuilt afterward. The reconstructed Altstadt (Old Town) is home to lively Römerberg Plaza, which hosts an annual Christmas market.

Many people travel through Frankfurt for business, as it's a major transportation hub and metropolis. Of course we know that business travellers hate to have any fun on the road (wink), but it's worth lingering in Frankfurt if you can. The 2,000-year-old city has much to offer: skyscrapers, the Main River, a famous opera house, thriving theatre district, zoo, pedestrian shopping street, parks, scores of bars and dance clubs, and more than 50 museums.

The Natural History Museum in Senckenberg shows itself to be more attractive than ever. For in 2003, the venerable old building dating back to 1907, with its extensive exhibition on the history of the Earth and evolution, was lavishly modernised. The Museum offers one of the most important natural history collections in Europe. Many of the thousands of exhibits are unique in the world or extremely rare. Almost 400,000 visitors come every year and follow the trail of plants, animals and humans.

The biggest attractions include the 'dinos'. Young and old alike wonder in awe at the skeletons of the Tyrannosaurus Rex, beaked dragon, raptors and co

A large area shows the universe from the time of the Big Bang until the birth of our planet. Fossils are also exhibited from the Messel pit, a UNESCO world natural heritage site where most scientific efforts are overseen by the Senckenberg Research Institute. Special exhibitions focus on topics related to nature and the environment. Guided tours and lectures introduce the results of research from the fields of biology, palaeontology and geology in the environment of the respective habitats.



Places to visit

The "Herrenberg slate quarry" near Bundenbach.

The slate of Bundenbach is of sedimentary origin. In a deep marine basin was slowly but steadily a fine sediment, deposited mainly of clay minerals. There were thin, dark layers of very fine grain. It was deposited about 390 million years ago, during the lower Devonian. It contains few but extraordinary fossils, which were collected from the slate quarry workers. The peculiarity of the Bundenbach fossils is the extremely good condition even the finest details, and soft parts of the body. This is due to the fine clay sediment in the animals were stored and the chemistry of the anaerobic sediment.

Castles along the rivers Rhine and Moselle.

For hundreds of years the Rhine has ranked as one of the most popular travel destinations in Europe. This region, truly one of the most beautiful in Germany, was recognized as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 2002. Spend plenty of time discovering the river, its castles and ruins, tales and legends and also those of its tributaries Moselle, Neckar and Main. The days are planned to offer you many highlights, but they are leisurely paced with time for you to explore on your own.

Frankfurt City Tour

Enjoy a two-hour Frankfurt sightseeing tour by open-top bus and see the contrasting sides of Frankfurt. Commonly known as an international trade hub, the city of Frankfurt actually boasts many different facets, with beautiful Baroque architecture, lively plazas and impressive modern skyscrapers. See the famous Romer town hall, walk around the Old Sachsenhausen district and marvel at the sleek buildings in Frankfurt's European banking centre.
