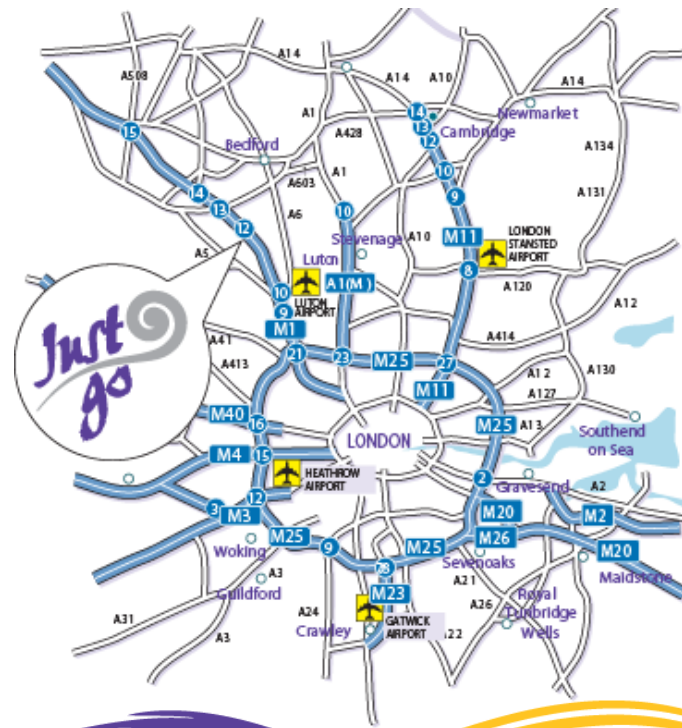


Camping La Campina

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Spain, Cordoba

Córdoba is a city in the southern Spanish province of Andalusia. It was an important Roman city and an Islamic cultural centre in the Middle Ages. It's best known for La Mezquita, an immense mosque dating to 600 C.E. featuring a columned prayer hall and Byzantine mosaics. A 1600s Catholic cathedral now occupies the centre of the mosque.

This thousand-year-old city, which has the World Heritage designation, is a living legacy of the different cultures that settled here throughout its history. If you walk round the old quarter you will discover a beautiful network of alleyways, squares and white-washed courtyards surrounding the Great Mosque-Cathedral, which reflects the importance of the city in the Middle Ages, and is the symbol of the city.

A visit to Cordoba is a rare opportunity to see the breath-taking results when Spanish, Islamic, and Ancient Roman architecture combines. With some of the highest temperatures in Spain, it's a great spring destination. The weather is pleasant year-round, but unless you like it really hot, avoid August. You can spend a few days here living the Spanish lifestyle, but the town is also a popular day trip destination from Granada, Madrid or Seville.



Places to visit

Historic Centre of Cordoba

Wonderful maze of tiny streets full of churches, museums, hotels, bars and restaurants. Worth taking a walking tour of the city to fully appreciate its very varied history.

Alcázar of Córdoba

A pretty Spanish castle offering wonderfully manicured gardens with shimmering ponds and a Moorish bathhouse. Lovely on a warm day, you can tour the grounds and palace for 4.50€.

Roman Bridge of Cordoba

The Roman bridge of Córdoba is a bridge in the Historic centre of Córdoba, Andalusia, Southern Spain, built in the early 1st century BC across the Guadalquivir River.

Calahorra Tower

This fortified gate lies in the historic city and was built to protect the Roman bridge. Get access to the museum for just 4.50€, where you can bone up on Cordoban history.

Roman temple of Cordoba

Next to the Town Hall of Cordoba stands the only Roman temple in Cordoba, which was discovered in the 1950s during the expansion of City Hall. It is located in the angle formed by the streets Claudio Marcelo and Capitulares.
