

Switzerland

Switzerland's small size and good transport network allows you to enjoy many of its attractions in a limited time with relative ease. With four dialects spoken and the continued influence of its bordering countries, it punches above its weight in diversity. Combine that with breath taking scenery around every bend and numerous cultural and historical attractions to see, it is a country well worth visiting on your journey through Europe.

Whether you want to take in the sights from the water in a boating trip across one of the many lakes, or exert yourself with a walk up in the clouds, there are several areas within the country to focus on.

One popular area is around Zermatt, a picture postcard car-less town in the shadow of the imposing Swiss icon that is the Matterhorn. With wooden chalets divided by narrow alleys and horse drawn carts to travel around in, it offers an image of Switzerland that many will recognise. With the mountains looking beautiful and activities continuing throughout the year, there is never an off season.

Notable cities to visit are Zurich with 50 museums and over 100 galleries. Its location on the shore of Lake Zurich has a stunning Alpine backdrop. Lucerne has one of the oldest Medieval covered wooden bridges in Europe, charming town squares and historic fresco covered houses. It is also the gateway to the central part of the country and is positioned on picture perfect Lake Lucerne.





Places to visit

Berr

The city of Bern has changed little in the last 500 years. Nestled in the crook on the River Aare, its cobbled lanes and sandstone houses are a charming place to explore. The surrounding countryside is characterised by steep sided wooded valleys and the city is a UNESCO world heritage site due to its four miles of covered arcades, the longest sheltered shopping promenade in Europe.

Ticino

The region known as Ticino has a distinctly Mediterranean feel to it, but with its lakes lined with palm trees, glaciers and traditional architecture it is also an area of contrasts. The town of Bellinzona has three castles, defensive walls and ramparts that are all UNESCO listed. There is a passion for food and wine with a strong Italian influence in the Mendrisiotto Region. You will also find fascinating art, unspoilt scenery and one of the best climates in Switzerland.

Ballenberg Museum

What started as 16 characteristic buildings in 1978, has now become a collection of over 100 residential and agricultural traditional Swiss buildings. Spread out through a park of 66 hectares, the native plantings, 250 farm animals and the presence of craftsman willing to provide informative demonstrations of their art make this an excellent place to stop and enjoy.
