

Set amongst the countryside near to the Welsh Borders, Shrewsbury is one of England's finest medieval market towns and it sits inside a loop of the River Severn, its Tudor centre is lined with half-timbered houses. The historic town centre still retains its medieval street pattern and many narrow passages and alley ways and Black & White buildings. It boasts over 600 listed buildings which include the Castle which is now a regimental museum and the world famous Shrewsbury Abbey.

Charles Darwin was born and educated in Shrewsbury and all around you will find reminders of his association with the town. The River Severn forms a loop around the town centre allowing for the perfect setting for a gentle river side walk or a trip on the new pleasure boat. There is plenty to do in Shrewsbury from the many shops to choose from to the yearly Flower show or Shrewsbury Folk Festival.
