

The city of Cork is a great place to start your tour of the southwest of Ireland. The city is wrapped around one of the largest natural harbours in the world and has a wealth of historical and cultural attractions to keep you busy.

Overlooking the River Lee is the 16th century castle that is now occupied by the Blackrock Castle Observatory. Created as an interactive science learning experience, there are exhibits and workshops to keep all ages entertained. When it's time to come back down to earth take a tour around the turrets and dungeons of this impressive monument.

The Glucksman Gallery promotes the creation and exploration of the visual arts and is housed in an award winning modern structure. With year round seasonal events and permanent exhibits on site, they cater to everyone passionate about the arts. To the west of Cork lies the Dingle Peninsula and the early Christian church that is the Gallarus Oratory, built between the 6th and 9th century.
